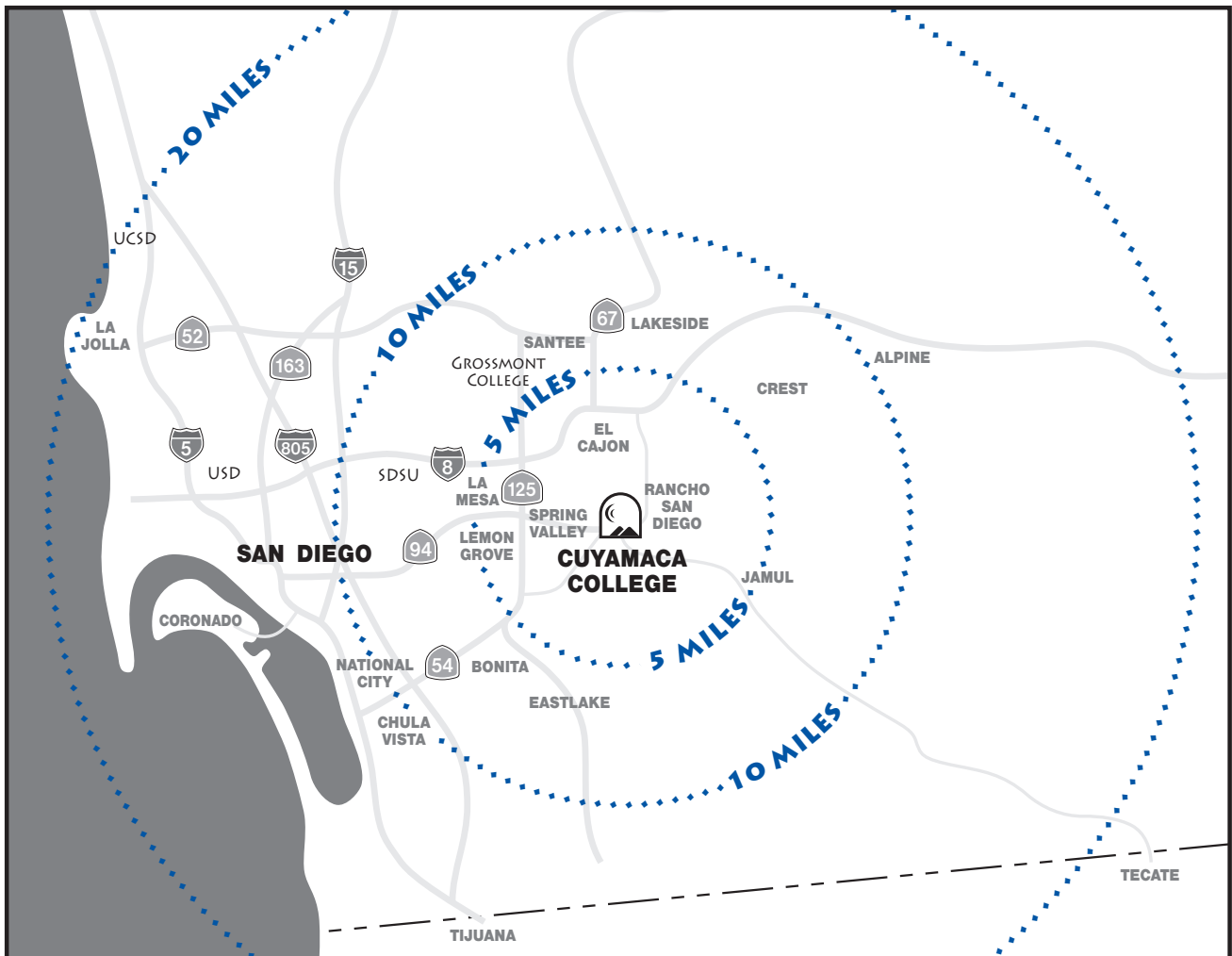


Minutes from the city of San Diego in the community of Rancho San Diego
