San Diego Robotics Education Expo

The San Diego Robotics Education Expo was held for the third year in a row at Cuyamaca College on Saturday, October 16. Approximately 350 visitors attended throughout the course of the day. Exhibitors included: University of San Diego, San Diego City College's robotics team, Wintress Technical Schools, High Tech High's robotics team, and of course Cuyamaca College's

very own microcontroller and robotics classes. Also we had an exhibitor from SPAWAR's robotics program. Dave Massey from San Diego Science Alliance conducted a Sea Perch workshop. Sea Perch is a Navy sponsored program, first developed through a Sea Grant at MIT, to get kids of all ages building underwater robots which are a standard size, approximately the size of a breadbox. There will be a competition with these in November. Recognition goes out to faculty member Dr. Duncan McGehee who coordinates this event every year in cooperation with the San Diego Science Alliance.



The Halls Are Alive with the Sound of Music

In October, the Performing Arts Department presented an evening of instrumental and vocal music from the Renaissance, performed by San Diego ensemble Courtly

Noyse on October 7th. The well attended program provided entertainment for aficionados of early music, but was also scheduled for around the time when music appreciation classes at both colleges would finish their units on Medieval and Renaissance music.

The department presented the first concert of its semester series for the Cuyamaca College Choir and Concert Band on October 12th. The Choir had its first performance under our new choral director, Merryl Nelson, and performed a program of American music that ranged from spirituals to showtunes. The concert band, under the stellar direction of Jeanne Christensen, presented a concert of autumn-themed music.

On October 18th, the department hosted their first concert of the season by the Grossmont College Concert Band, under the direction of Russ Sperling. And on October 21st, the department presented Amassi Al-Sharq ("Evening Nights"), an ensemble led by Luay Yousif that performed traditional music from the Middle East. This event was conceived as both an

enrichment activity for students in the Introduction to World Music class and an outreach activity to the Chaldean community.

The focus of Disabilities Awareness Month is to teach and increase awareness of how capable people with disabilities actually are. The San Diego Xpress team, a formal league wheelchair basketball team here in San Diego, comes out to Cuyamaca College each year for this event to face off with our Cuyamaca College athletes (most of which are from our men's college

basketball team) for a very exciting game! All players are put in the athletic wheelchairs and the teams are then mixed to equalize the playing field. Any spectators and students are welcome to play in the game. One of the highlights of this year's game was watching our Interim President, Robert Garber, participate and play in the game. What a sport! Our College Coyote tried his luck in the athletic chair too, playing in the game as well as various other students. This event is a great time of coming together and a wonderful experiential education that includes a lot of fun and excitement for students, faculty, staff, administrators, and Board Members.

14th Annual Aggie Open Golf Tournament

This is an annual fundraising event for the Cuyamaca College Botanical Society and the Ornamental Horticulture Program. This year's event at the Bonita Golf Course attracted over 125 golfers with many industry leaders in attendance and sponsors of the event. CCBS officers and volunteers from the OH department kept the tournament running smoothly all day! A great deal of work was required both in preparation for the day and during the event. The generosity and number of participating sponsors this year was incredible. Horizon provided



tremendous support as our corporate sponsor, and an impressive list of companies and individual sponsors made the fundraiser more successful than we ever could have expected. The tournament raised over \$10,000 for the Cuyamaca College Botanical Society and Ornamental Horticulture Program.

Center for Innovation Activity

The Center for Innovation within the office of Continuing Education serves as the umbrella for many of the contract and grant-funded professional and vocational programs housed at Cuyamaca College. Many are regional programs funded to serve all of San Diego and Imperial counties. Below is a brief summary of their recent activities:

- The Green Building Program coordinated and delivered a 3-day Train the Trainer to eight instructors representing Cuyamaca, Southwestern, SDCCD Continuing Education, and Mira Costa's course facilitators for the Green Building Program.
- During the months of September and October, 35 individuals attended Building Performance Institute (BPI) training at Cuyamaca College. Staff is working with graduates on job search activities.
- Twenty-three students who recently completed the Water Conservation course took the American Water Works Association certification exam hosted at Vallecitos Water District.
- Continuing Education in partnership with the credit ESL program is offering a 150 hour intensive basic ESL pilot to prepare students to enter credit classes in the spring 2011 semester.
- As part of the BADGER (Border Area Development and Growth of Environmental Responsibility) project the Environmental Training Center, in conjunction with the County of San Diego, hosted an Automotive Compliance Workshop in National City. The event served over 45 small business owners and employees from the automotive industry.

- Jonathan Kropp recently wrote BP Solar's competitive donation program and competed against many other organizations and training institutes for a limited number of solar panels. To our success, Cuyamaca's solar program was picked to receive four state-of-the-art BP panels valued between \$650.00 and \$900.00 per unit. The panels will be utilized by our solar program to both benchmark efficiency and add to the hands-on curricula which makes up over 25% of our introduction course.
- On October 27th, Alan Ridley gave a presentation on the green training programs offered at Cuyamaca College at the Energy Efficiency & Conservation Workshops sponsored by Southern CA Tribal Chairmen's Association.

Coyotes Run Well at Conference Meet

The Cuyamaca Women's Cross Country Team qualified two for the Regional Meet, while the Men's team qualified with 3 All-Conference performances at the Pacific Coast Conference Championships held at Guajome Park on Thursday October 29th. Woman runners Kate Leidiger and Heather Mort qualified for the regional meet at the Pacific Coast Conference Meet, held in late October These two who have been leading the women's team all year, narrowly miss making all conference, but are able to qualify for the regional meet.



The men's team was led by Nick Haimes who ran 21:59 for the 4-mile race, to place 9th over all. Next up was Mike Gorney who ran a superb race to place 11th in a time of 22:19. It was Mike's fastest time of the season, just in time for regional championships. Eddie Corvera, who placed 12th, ran a 22:22. All three, Nick, Mike and Eddie earned All-Conference with their performances.
