Student Success Day



Cuyamaca College hosted their first Student Success Day on Monday, August 15, for all incoming first-time students. There were over 100 students that participated at the event. Workshops were offered with information regarding scholarships, financial aid, transferring to a four year college or university, chemistry, STEM, and math and chemistry classes. Students participated in a Scavenger Hunt called Cuyamaca GO (a spin on Pokémon Go) where they had to capture "maca balls" around campus in order to win

prizes. Information tables of student services were located in the Student Center. Campus tours were also available throughout the event. The Grad Guru wheel was there for students to win prizes for

The event provided new students and their family members the opportunity to tour the college, check out where their classes were located, and interact with current students about college life. College Receives Hispanic Serving Institution Grant

Cuyamaca College received notification that "The Pathway Academy" has been selected for funding. This grant competition was extremely competitive and the U.S. Department of Education only funds the "best of the best" grant proposals. This process has been a long journey which began in 2012 and continued until we finally received approval; perseverance pays off. This grant will provide the college with the much needed resources to implement and strengthen the work that is currently underway (Strategic Plan, Achieving the Dream, Student Equity, Basic Skills, SSSP, etc.) and build institutional capacity to support student success. The grant cycle is for five years and begins October 1, 2016. The total grant amount is \$2,571,809, which was the total amount we requested.
