Encuentros Leadership & Education Conference

To assist us in hosting this event we partnered with Encuentros Leadership, a non-profit organization which for the past 15 years has been based out of North County San Diego. The conference was specifically aimed at young Latino boys in middle or high school and their parents from our local community and we are proud to say Cuyamaca is the first community college to host an Encuentros conference outside of North County San Diego. Diego and community partners in which screenings are offered at dozens of locations throughout the County. Over 150 individuals were screened by Cuyamaca College's mental health counselors for anxiety and depression and referred to outside services as needed.



This year there was live music, relaxation tables with arts and crafts, healthy refreshments from Sahara Restaurant, and numerous community representatives including mental health counselors from Family Health Centers, Veterans Services, and Kickstart/Pathways Behavioral Health Services.




Institute for Educators on Teaching Economics & Personal Finance

The San Diego Center for Economic Education at Cuyamaca College co-hosted a three-day institute on economics and personal finance for high school and community college instructors at the University of San Diego during June 2018. Thirty-five teachers from around the United States attended the institute. The institute, *Building Blocks for Economic Education*, was organized by the San Diego Center for Economic Education at Cuyamaca College in partnership with the California Council on Economic Education and in association with the Federal Reserve banks of Atlanta, Dallas, San Francisco and St. Louis. The educators who attended learned about effective interactive lessons, emphasizing infographics and utilizing other tools that can meet any teaching style pertaining to economics and personal finance. The San Diego Center for Economic Education at Cuyamaca College trains scores of elementary and high

school teachers each year on the best methods for teaching economics in the classroom and how to infuse economics into other subject areas such as history or geography. There are six centers for economic education in California; the San Diego Center for Economic Education is the only one that is hosted by a community college.
