

# President's Report to the Governing Board February 22, 2005

#### 1. ENROLLMENT UPDATE

The following is an analysis of the Spring 2005 enrollment compared with Spring 2004 enrollment as of census.

## 2. CONGRESSIONAL AWARD

Through the leadership of Congressman Duncan Hunter and Trustee Wendell Cutting, the college received a congressional award for the Computer Information Science Program. The award, in the amount of \$94,208, is for the federal fiscal year starting 2004-2005. The award will assist the CIS program in equipping the telecommunications labs, augmenting tutorial services, and providing support for on-line courses. Kudos to Chancellor Suarez and Ms. Dana Quittner for their efforts in facilitating this initiative.

# 3. PRESIDENT PARTICIPATES IN WORKFORCE PARTNERSHIP PANEL

On January 27<sup>th</sup>, President Perri and Mr. Larry Fitch, CEO/President of the San Diego Workforce Partnership traveled to Phoenix, Arizona to participate in the American Association of Community Colleges/Workforce Development Institute Conference as part of a panel discussion on the role of Workforce Investment Boards and community colleges. Dr. Perri and Mr. Fitch presented the San Diego Workforce Alliance Project, which was spearheaded by Chancellor Suarez in 2002 as a regional project and has become a model initiative for linking education, business and industry.

Both Dr. Perri and Mr. Fitch have been asked to present at the California Community Colleges 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Economic Development Conference this April on the San Diego Workforce Alliance Project.

#### 4. President Perri Named Water Conservation Garden Board Vice President

At the January 12<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Water Conservation Garden Authority, President Perri, then serving as Treasurer of the Board was unanimously elected Vice President. New to the Board, representing the Helix Water District is Mr. Charles Muse; Mr. Mark Robak representing the Otay Water District; and Mr. Warren Buckner, former Helix representative, will now serve as a Board alternate for the San Diego County Water Authority.

# 5. FACULTY PUBLICATION

Congratulations to Dr. Donna Riley, Exercise Science/ Health Instructor, who has had her manuscript entitled "Use of Self-assessed Fitness and Exercise Parameters to Predict Objective Fitness" accepted by "Medicine and Science in Sport and Exercise," a prestigious journal of the American College of Sports Medicine. Donna conducted the research at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, and the Naval Health Research Center from June 2002 to June 2003. Donna is first author and this is her first attempt at journal submission!

Cuyamaca College hosted a Math and Science High School Outreach day on Friday, February 4, 2005. Sixty- five high school students from Mount Miguel and El Cajon Valley attended various Math and Science workshops offered by Cuyamaca College instructors Laurie LeBlanc, Terrie Nichols, Scott Eckert and Tammi Marshall. A tour of the science lab and the hands-on experiments in chemical reactions, crystallization and polymers were highlights of the day. In addition, both workshops provided students with career opportunities available in Math and Science. The day ended with a pizza lunch and all students received a participation award and an outreach folder. A second Math and Science Field Day is scheduled for Friday, April 8, 2005 with participants from Monte Vista and Valhalla High Schools.
