1. CUYAMACA COLLEGE IN POPULAR SCIENCE

Congratulations to Cuyamaca College Astronomy student, Danny LaCrue, who submitted a composite picture of the Tarantula Nebula and was featured in the March 2005, edition of *Popular Science*.

2. COLLEGE PANEL PRESENTS INSTITUTIONAL STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES MODEL (STANDING ROOM ONLY!!)

On Wednesday, March 9th, a team of four faculty and administrative staff members of the college including Michael Wangler, Geography Instructor and Curriculum Committee Co-Chair; Kristin Zink, Child Development Department Coordinator; Cristina Chiriboga, Vice President, Instruction, and Al Taccone, Division Dean of Instruction presented at the statewide Chief-Instructional Officers/Chief Student Services Officers Conference, *United We Stand*. The topic was on the College Student Learning Outcomes Model, shared governance processes, and the training activities related to it. The group also addressed next steps and an analysis of key factors in implementation. The presentation drew a capacity crowd and was very well received!
