#### WHAT YOU CAN EARN

Wages in this industry vary widely according to the position. Landscaping and groundskeeping workers, for example, earn an average wage of nearly \$30,220 annually in San Diego County, according to the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics. Floral designers in the region earn an average annual wage of \$33,510. Pesticide handlers, sprayers and applicators earn an average annual wage of \$46,600. Landscape architects, who typically need a bachelor's degree, earn an average annual wage of more than \$95,000 in San Diego County.
