
VALUES




A Vision for Student Success and Equity

Student Success and Equity Committee's preliminary "watermark" for our Strategic Plan:




Understanding Loss and Momentum Points: Completion By Design Framework

Connection Completion Entry **Progress** Interest to Enrollment to Entry into program Complete program application completion of first of study to 75% of study to credential college-level course of requirement with labor market completion value

The Why: Student Progress and Completion

Out of 1,670 first-time students who started in 2010/11...

- 3 in 4 persisted to the subsequent fall
- **7 in 10** completed 30 units within 6 years
- But just **4 in 10** completed a degree, certificate, transferred or became transfer prepared within 6 years



Progress and Completion through an Preparedness Lens


Prepared Students:

2 in 3 complete a degree, certificate, transfer or become transfer-prepared within 6 years

Unprepared Students:

Less than **2 in 5** complete a degree, certificate, transfer or become transfer-prepared within 6 years


Only about 1 in 7 entering students fell into the "prepared category" in 2010/11



Acceleration: Concurrent Enrollment Support to Address the "Preparedness" Achievement Gap




Math Placements by Ethnicity: Transfer-Level (All)



Math Successes: Transfer-Level (throughput rates tripled in two years)


Cuyamaca First-Time Students' Transfer-Level Math Enrollments and Successes



English Placements by Ethnicity: Transfer-Level (All)


