The preliminary "watermark" for our Strategic Plan:



Fall 2016 First-Time Students Placing into Transfer Math at Cuyamaca College



Tripling Math Throughput in 2016:


First-Time Student Enrollments and Success in Transfer Math

- Increased demand for higher level classes




Outcomes: Guided Student Pathways

Opportunities: Guided Student Pathways

- Clear and directed student centered paths to completion
- Integration of planning (Equity/BSI/SSSP/Strong) in support of the GSP model
- Improve/enhance the intersection between instruction and student services
- Student web portal for Educational Planning

Outcomes: Student Validation and Engagement

- Successful past engagement practices expanded campus wide (frosh & faculty mixer, pumpkin carving, kickball games)
- Initiated culturally relevant validation events (Martin Luther King JR. and Cesar Chavez Celebration)
- Cultural Competence professional development series for students, faculty, and classified staff
- Established Engagement Ambassadors to support efforts via Student Affairs

Outcomes: Organizational Health

- Completed new college plans
 - Strategic Plan, tutoring, distance ed, professional development
- Revision of governance structures and processes
- 1.0 FTE for campus wide Professional Development Coordinator
- 1.0 FTE for faculty Tutoring Coordinator
- Obtained \$12 million in grants
- Establishment of Institutional Effectiveness, Success and Equity Unit
- Piloted Staffing Prioritization Task Force



Opportunities: Organizational Health

- Growth with efficiency: continuing to shift culture toward efficiency (enrollment management)
- Expanded professional development for faculty and classified staff
- Policy alignment/procedure alignment with strategic goals
- ECEA-partnerships with K-12s
