First-Year Experience (FYE) – Writing Center Student Comparison Report Description

This report compares the English and ESL course success and retention outcomes of First-Year Experience (FYE) students who used the Cuyamaca College Writing Center to students who did not use the Center in Fall 2014 or Spring 2015. In Fall 2014 and Spring 2015, there were 300 FYE student enrollments in English coursework (including reading courses) and 18 in ESL coursework (including reading and lab courses). Additionally, course success and retention outcomes have been disaggregated by gender, race/ethnicity, and disability status for students in this cohort of FYE students who took English coursework at Cuyamaca College in Fall 2014 or Spring 2015. Due to the low number of FYE student enrollments in ESL coursework, analyses were not disaggregated by demographic subgroups for those courses.

Definitions & Cohort Criteria

First-Year Experience (FYE) Students – Students who participated in the First-Year Experience (FYE) program at Cuyamaca College in Fall 2014 and/or Spring 2015.

Writing Center Users – FYE students who were tracked as having used Cuyamaca College Writing Center services in Fall 2014 and/or Spring 2015 while they were enrolled in an English or ESL course, had a valid student ID number, and who did not report using the Writing Center for a course at Grossmont College (i.e., tutoring was for Cuyamaca College-based coursework).

Comparison Students – Cohort students who did not utilize Writing Center services during the term they were enrolled in ENGL-090.

Summary of Findings

In general, FYE students who utilized Writing Center services in Fall 2014 and/or Spring 2015 demonstrated higher course success and retention rates in their English and/or ESL courses compared to FYE students who did not utilize those services. This trend held true even when disaggregated into demographic subpopulations (the one exception being for course success for African-American/Black and White students in English courses in Spring 2015; however, these subgroups were only comprised of three students each).

These results should be interpreted with caution as generalization of the findings should not be inferred from data regarding the outcomes of smaller subgroups. Additionally, causality cannot necessarily be concluded from these findings. While Writing Center usage is likely having a positive effect on students' academic outcomes, it could also be the case that more academically-minded and academically-motivated students are the ones who opt into using these types of services and may already have a higher likelihood of success than their counterparts.

Figure 1: Overall English Course Success & Retention Rates by Writing Center Usage, 2014-15 FYE Cohort






Figure 2: Overall ESL Course Success & Retention Rates by Writing Center Usage, 2014-15 FYE Cohort
