<p>How to prevent STDs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Don't have Sex! ⇒ Use condoms with every sex partner ⇒ Get tested (and treated) every 4-6 months ⇒ Talk to your partner(s) about STDs and protection ⇒ Don't mix sex with drugs and alcohol ⇒ Limit the number of people you have sex with ⇒ Use PrEP or PEP to lower your risk of getting HIV ⇒ PASS THIS ON! <p>Look on the back of this page for more information on testing locations</p>	<p>Transmission by 4 fluids:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Human = between 2 people Immune-deficiency = a weak immune system, causing you to be sick longer Virus = infection that can't be cured Cause by Unprotected Sex with someone who is HIV+ or of unknown status <p>Genital Warts: Pink/white patches of skin growths that grow around or inside the genital/anal region(s). Highly contagious by touch.</p> <p>Treatment: Antiviral medication</p> <p>Hepatitis B: Causes flu-like symptoms for months at a time; can cause liver damage if not treated</p> <p>Treatment: Antiviral medication to slow down outbreaks</p> <p>Herpes A & B: Painful sores on the mouth (Type A) or on the genitals (Type B); highly contagious by contact</p>	<p>Treatment: Frozen/burned off with creams of chemical freezing</p> <p>Treatment: Bacteria can be cured with antibiotic medication depending on the severity of bacteria.</p> <p>3rd Stage: Rash on the bottoms of feet and palms of hands; this, disappears after a month causes brain damage years later</p> <p>2nd Stage: Painless sore(s) on genitals/mouth/anus which appear after a month causes pores of your skin and hide under fingernails and warm parts of your body. Their bite marks look like a flea bite.</p> <p>Syphilis: These bugs dig tunnels in the skin when they are scratching and biting your skin.</p>	<p>Treatment: Parasites can be cured with parasitic creams and lotions, which can be prescribed by doctors.</p> <p>Scabies: These bugs dig tunnels in the pubic hair and try to make more bugs by laying eggs in your public hair roots and pubic lice: These crab-like bugs hide in pubic hair and try to make more bugs by laying eggs in your public hair roots and</p>
